Conference theme: Mobility in a post-pandemic world

We face unprecedented challenges for understanding and forecasting travel behaviour in a context of high uncertainty due to the pandemic.

User behaviour and transport supply will probably change significantly, making travel forecast more difficult than ever, but also offering a unique opportunity to observe behavioural change in what is possibly the largest natural experiment we have experienced in decades.

The pandemic also offers a unique opportunity to adapt our cities to much needed changes facing climate change, the economic crisis, and other potential upcoming global challenges.

Better understanding and forecasting travel behaviour becomes a key resource to advance in the right direction, exploiting new data sources and pushing the methodological state of the art to the frontier through multidisciplinary scientific collaboration.

Submission guidelines

Presentations for various sessions will be selected based on an extended abstract (around 1.500 to 2.000 words).

Interested authors should submit their abstracts electronically at EasyChair by November 2, 2020.

Although authors can submit as many extended abstracts as desired, only one presentation per registration will be permitted. Authors wanting to present more than once can pay an additional registration fee.



Themes and topics

The conference welcomes submissions on all aspects of travel behaviour research and application.

To facilitate paper submission and organisation of the programme, we have identified eight thematic categories:

1. Post-pandemic travel behaviour
2. New data collection methods and data sources
3. Sustainable mobility
4. Machine learning and other new methods
5. Human interactions and social networks
6. Psychometric and perceptions
7. Advanced modelling and simulation
8. Other topics

Please classify your extended abstract (within the document itself) in one of these eight categories when submitting.

Abstract Guidelines

Extended abstracts should be detailed enough to provide adequate information on the motivation, the novelty and contributions, the data and analysis methods, potential applicability, and expected results.

Submissions should include the following information:

- Title
- Authors
- Contact information
- Submission topic (as explained above)
- 3 to 5 keywords
- Extended abstract (around 1.500 to 2.000 words)
- References
